BCNU leaders locked out staff and provoked a strike.

BCNU staff would rather be at work supporting nurses.

But on July 22, BCNU leadership locked out the staff, tried to impose a contract and forced a strike. Leadership refuses to negotiate.

This strike is not about money.

Like nurses, BCNU staff want a fairly negotiated collective agreement. BCNU leadership is trying to roll back previously negotiated benefits. Staff are fighting to keep access to medical appointment and family obligation leave. Staff never even had a chance to negotiate wages before being locked out.

BCNU leaders violated their own union principles.

By locking out BCNU staff and imposing concessions, they are telling health employers that nurses are ok with these aggressive tactics when it comes to bargaining their own contracts.
